MINUTES OF THE 91st MEETING OF THE CONVENTION CENTER AUTHORITY OF THE METROPOLITAN GOVERNMENT OF NASHVILLE & DAVIDSON COUNTY

The 91st meeting of the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County (CCA) was held on March 5, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. in the Administrative Conference Room of the Administrative Offices at the Music City Center, Nashville, Tennessee.

Chair Marty Dickens opened the meeting for business at 9:01 a.m. and stated that a quorum was present.

ACTION: Appeal of Decisions from the Convention Center Authority of the Metropolitan Government of Nashville and Davidson County – Pursuant to the provisions of § 2.68.030 of the Metropolitan Code of Laws, please take notice that decisions of the Convention Center Authority may be appealed if and to the extent applicable to the Chancery Court of Davidson County for review under a common law writ of certiorari. These appeals must be filed within sixty days after entry of a final decision by the Authority. Any person or other entity considering an appeal should consult with private legal counsel to ensure that any such appeals are timely and that all procedural requirements are met.

ACTION: Irwin Fisher made a motion to approve the 90th Meeting Minutes of January 16, 2020. The motion was seconded by Randy Rayburn and approved unanimously by the Authority.

The next regularly scheduled meeting is scheduled for April 9, 2020 at 9:00 am.

Randy Rayburn, Charles Starks, and Heidi Runion reviewed the Music City Center Fiscal Year 2021 Operating and Capital Budget and discussed the recommendation to implement the increase in employee wages as of April 4, 2020 which was approved by the Finance and Audit Committee on February 27, 2020 (Attachment #1) and there was discussion.

ACTION: Randy Rayburn made a motion accepting the recommendation of the Finance and Audit Committee and approving the 2021 Fiscal Year Operating and Capital Budget to fund the activities, operations and capital needs of the Music City

Center and authorizing the increase in employee wages as of April 4, 2020. The motion was seconded by Robert Davidson and approved unanimously by the Authority.

Chairman Marty Dickens provided an update on the Executive Committee (Attachment #1) and there was discussion.
